



ASUR Announces Certification under Airport Carbon Accreditation Program

The company obtained Level-1 certification for the 9 Mexican airports in the Group

Mexico City, October 21st, 2020 - Grupo Aeroportuario del Sureste, S.A.B. de C.V. (NYSE: ASR; BMV: ASUR), a leading international airport group with operations in Mexico, the U.S. and Colombia, today announced that it has obtained certification for its airports under the Airport Carbon Accreditation program (ACA).

In accordance with its environmental policies and sustainability strategies, ASUR is committed to taking steps with the aim of progressively reducing its emissions of greenhouse gases (GHG), also referred to as carbon emissions.

The 9 airports operated by the Group in Mexico recently obtained Level-1 certification under the ACA program, established by Airports Council International (ACI) to create a standard for managing carbon emissions in the world's airports.

Under the ACA Level 1 requirements, ASUR has certified the mapping of controlled emissions in each of its airports, which are mainly due to the consumption of fossil fuels as well as electricity supplied by the national grid.

The certification was presented to ASUR by the Director General of Airports Council International for Latin American and the Caribbean (ACI-LAC), Dr. Rafael Echevarne, who said: *"We recognize the efforts and dedication of Grupo Aeroportuario del Sureste in the mitigation of the impact of its operations on the environment, by creating a complete, independently verified inventory of carbon emissions and outlining plans for how to reduce these emissions. Excellent work!"*

The Level-1 ACA certification was audited by SGS Perú and includes an ISO14064-1 declaration referring to the emissions mapping for each airport. Enerion Renewables, an Italian consulting firm, assisted ASUR in ACA and ISO14064-1 certification procedures.

The next step for ASUR will be to advance to Level 2 in each of its airports, where the main objective will be to demonstrate a reduction in controlled emissions. The ultimate goal for the medium term will be to certify all airports as carbon neutral under Levels 3+ of the ACA program.

Grupo Aeroportuario del Sureste, S.A.B. de C.V. (ASUR) is a leading international airport operator with a portfolio of concessions to operate, maintain and develop 16 airports in the Americas. This comprises nine airports in southeast Mexico, including Cancun Airport, the most important tourist destination in Mexico, the Caribbean and Latin America, and six airports in northern Colombia, including Medellin international airport (Rionegro), the



second busiest in Colombia. ASUR is also a 60% JV partner in Aerostar Airport Holdings, LLC, operator of the Luis Muñoz Marín International Airport serving the capital of Puerto Rico, San Juan. San Juan's Airport is the island's primary gateway for international and mainland-US destinations and was the first, and currently the only major airport in the US to have successfully completed a public-private partnership under the FAA Pilot Program. Headquartered in Mexico, ASUR is listed both on the Mexican Bolsa, where it trades under the symbol ASUR, and on the NYSE in the U.S., where it trades under the symbol ASR.
